WALKING IN THE FOOTSTEPS - ABRAHAM ABINU

Ever since Abraham Abinu was a young boy, he searched for truth. He looked for causes of the phenomena that he observed in the world and found the ad hoc answers that people offered him insufficient. In his search for causes he came to discover the ultimate cause of all things, and in that discovery he found God.

God enters into a covenant with Abraham commanding him to walk before Him. Abraham, therefore, walked in front of G-d, on a journey of self-discovery and self-actualisation. It is important that we understand what it means to walk as Abraham did because we are his children and inheritors of his legacy.

Abraham challenged people's idols and their need to placate their psychology with superstitions. He encouraged people to guestion their assumptions about reality. He recognised that people were immersed in irrational fears and behaviours and were not interested in properly assessing reality. Instead they were locked into the confines of their own minds, worshipping their own ideas rather than God.

Abraham kept his assumptions about the nature of reality to a minimum and therefore did not assume that he knew how to serve God. He instead worked on connecting to God, the source of all existence, by cultivating and supporting life through helping others in the best way he could. We call this Hesed.

We call Abraham an Ab/Father, because his vision set the ultimate paradigm for the



people of Israel. Like Abraham we strive to commit ourselves to searching for truth and cultivating life through true kindness. We see every aspect of creation as expressions of God and in them we discover Him. By being bold enough to relinquish our superstitions and false perceptions of reality we genuinely open

ISAAC AND HIS FEAR

The emotion of fear is attributed to all of our Biblical forefathers. Abraham is described as one who fears God. and we are told that Jacob fears Esab. It is concerning Isaac, however, that the appellation of fear is most closely linked. Indeed, it is his son Jacob that invokes it. Jacob tells his father in law and uncle Laban that if it were not for the God of Abraham and the fear of Isaac, Laban would have sent him away empty-handed. What does the fear of Isaac in this context mean?

Fear is an emotion that can be both useful and damaging. Fear helps to turn us away from acting in dangerous ways. On the other hand, fear has the capacity to paralyze us, and to stop us from taking the kinds of risks necessary to succeed in life. Both of these kinds of fears are reflected in the treatment of Isaac's fear among the commentaries.

According to Kil Yakar, the fear in guestion refers to the fear Laban should have of Isaac. Jacob was indicating to his pursuer that Isaac was still alive and was a powerful man not to be reckoned with. On the other hand, Rashi and Ibn Ezra explain that the fear of Isaac is a euphemism for God, as in the One that Isaac fears. The 'fear of Isaac' can either be the 'fear of man' or the 'fear of God.'

It is not surprising that the word fear can imply two different things, as most qualities can either be healthy or destructive depending on context or degree. However, when it comes to fear of heaven, the very meaning of that fear is unclear. To describe a person as a 'fearer of heaven' is to give them praise. But what does it mean to 'fear heaven'?



Classically, to fear heaven is to fear retribution. The one who fears God does not sin because they believe in a God of justice. Such a person has great faith and is therefore praiseworthy. Rambam, however, explained fear of heaven in more conceptual terms. According to Maimonides to fear God is to be in awe of Him. A person looks at the world around them and cannot help but love such a creator, but at same moment they also become overwhelmed by His greatness and shrink in His presence. As with most things in life, the exact determination remains obscure, but finds itself somewhere along a continuum of possibilities. However, wherever we land on that spectrum, we strive to be like our forefathers in our relationship with God.



THE LIFE OF JACOB: IN BRIEF.

Torah descended from heaven with an ambitious task-teaching morality to a people created in G-d's image. Our nation Israel was founded by the man Israel, named Jacob by his parents, renamed Israel in a vision of G-d. The standards demanded by the Torah are revealed in large part by its "warts and all" portrait of Jacob.

The boy Jacob is his mother's favourite - better looking than his twin, smooth skinned, more helpful and more religious however he lacked the street smarts that his hunter brother possessed; you may say he was too sheltered. The manly Esav is his father's favourite. The Torah tells how Jacob tricks Esav out of his birthright and out of his blessing.

Jacob refuses to feed his exhausted brother coming back from an expedition in the summer heat unless he receives Esav's birth right as payment. Additonally, with help from his mother, Jacob steals Esav's blessing for the best land and tribal leadership. Fearing Esav's rage, Isaac sends Jacob to live with his Uncle Laban in distant Haran. Isaac recognised in Jacob his religious heir and this time blessed him knowing exactly who he was blessing. Alone in the desert, Jacob begins the process of arowing up.

With the help of a Divine dream Jacob realises that to utilise his stolen blessing and birth right he must turn his life around. Jacob does become better but finds himself up against Uncle Laban-the master of tricks and manipulation. Jacob is tricked into an unwelcome marriage and later tricked out of his wages. The young Jacob grows into the man Jacob in the home of Laban but after a while he decides that he'd had enough of living in such a disreputable house and heads back home.

Jacob realises Esav is angry because he has been wronged. He assumes that paying compensation for the blessings he stole from his brother will buy back peace within the family. Esav accepts Jacob's compensation and together they make peace; with Esav becoming more religious in the process (though just to please his parents). Later, together with Jacob, Esav buries his father Isaac.

Our father Israel grows up and grows honest. A good man despite his sheltered upbringing and the favouritism he received.

MOSHE - A GREAT AND HUMBLE LEADER

There are two verses in the Torah that seem to define Moshe Rabbeinu. Moshe is called the greatest prophet that ever lived and ever will. He is also referred to as Anav Mikkol Adam, the most humble person to walk the face of the planet.

Why does the Torah choose to refer to Moshe with these two specific traits and what is the connection between them?

Furthermore, the Meshech Chochma asks a brilliant question. We understand how Hashem can attest to Moshe being the greatest prophet who will ever live, as this is something that He is totally in control of. But how can Hashem guarantee that there will never be a person to live who is as humble as Moshe?

The answer he suggests is that these two things are totally interlinked. The reason why there can never be a man as humble in this world as Moshe, is because he was the greatest prophet!

He explains that the higher the level the prophet, meaning the higher level of revelation they have been exposed to, the more humble the prophet becomes.

The idea seems completely counter-intuitive. Meaning the greater the person, the more he sees Hashem and the wonders of His creation, the more humble that person becomes!

To be a leader of the Jewish people therefore means to be someone who doesn't allow the greatness to go to his head. His greatness, the heights that he reaches, are things that cause him to be more humble and realise that Hashem is the One in control and has allowed him to reach such heights.

AHARON - HOW TO START A PEACE PROCESS

SHALOM. One of the most ubiguitous words in Judaism. The first word we say when we greet someone is Shalom, Peace. Every day, three times a day, we conclude the amidah with a prayer for peace. On Shabbat we bless each other with a hearty Shabbat Shalom. The last word in the Priestly Blessing is Shalom.

Aharon Hakohen's name is synonymous with peace. Aharon loved and pursued peace and was an expert at resolving fractured relationships. Indeed, Aharon's death, in contrast to Moshe's, was marked by the entire Jewish nation; men, women and children wept for him for 30 days. His ability to facilitate peace was sorely missed by all segments of the Jewish nation. What was the secret of his success?

On the day of the inauguration of the Tabernacle, Nadab and Abihu, the two eldest sons of Aharon, met an untimely death as a result of offering incense which they had not been commanded to offer. The Torah's description of Aharon's reaction to the death of his two sons is profound: "Vavidom Aharon". "And Aharon kept silent". Being that Nadab and Abihu were attempting to draw near to G-d, Aharon could have guestioned the fairness of their deaths. Instead, he remained silent and resigned himself to the just sentence G-d had imposed upon his sons.

Aharon has just lost his eldest two sons, who were engaged in serving G-d and he doesn't even question it? Astoundingly, Aharon retains his composure and willingly accepts the Divine Decree. He receives the most tragic news with such equanimity and serenity. He was at peace with the situation and with himself. Here, Aharon clearly demonstrates his accepting and peaceful characteristics. Peace is being able to tolerate and respect other people's decisions and Aharon's nature epitomized this quality. When two dissenting parties would observe Aharon they would be reminded how to accept the trials and tribulations of life and be respectful of other's views and opinions.



The first step to being at peace with others is to be at peace with oneself. When one works on accepting challenges in life, when one uses the difficulties in life as springboards for success, then he can begin to be at peace with others.

'Hillel said: be of the students of Aharon: Love peace and pursue peace; love people and bring them close to the Torah' (Ethics of the Fathers 1:12).

Eliezer - Eved Avraham · Guest Debar Torah

Eliezer was an assistant to Avraham Avinu, who, behind the scenes, leads a multi-lavered life of crucial significance for the foundation of Klal Yisrael. We are not told anything about his origins nor about his eventual destiny, but he was a loyal and trustworthy servant of Avraham through difficult and trying times.

Here are three key moments in his life which illustrate his extraordinary qualities.

1. Avraham, in Parshat Lech Lecha, needs to go into battle against the four most powerful tribal leaders of the region in order to save his nephew Lot, who did not deserve to be saved in his own merit. However, in one of the unfathomable twists of Jewish history. Lot was going to become the ancestor of David Hamelech. Lot is being saved in the zechut of his progeny despite his own shortcomings. In this battle, Avraham is greatly outnumbered and also untrained in warfare. He mobilises "318 of his students" (Br.14.14) referred to as "chanichav" who Rashi understands to be a reference to Eliezer and that 318 is the gematria of the name Eliezer. The use of that number in the pasuk alludes to the fact that the ultimate victory is attributed to Eliezer. So the first appearance of Eliezer is as the military Chief of Staff of Avraham in a crucial battle to save the ancestor of the future David Hamelech.

2. The second reference to Eliezer appears (Br.15.2) when Avraham says that in the absence of children, all he has in this world by way of continuity is "Damesek Eliezer". While the pshat of the word "Damesek" is simply the town Damascus, Rashi cites the Midrash that this alludes to Eliezer as the one who was "doleh u'mashkeh mi'torat rabbo le'acherim" - meaning that Eliezer was transmitting to mankind the wisdom and teachings of Avraham. Clearly his role was not only military, but also in the life-work of Avraham, in spreading the light of Emunah and Chesed to the world.

3.A third reference is in Parshat Chayei Sarah in finding a wife for Yitzchak, Avraham instructs someone who is described (Br.24.2) as the "zekan beito ha'moshel be'kol asher lo", - meaning a fully trusted individual totally in charge of the estate and household of Avraham. Chazal identify this person as Eliezer. This project requires total Emunah, very sound judgement, diplomacy and negotiation skills of the highest level.



Eliezer is able to function here in a self-effacing manner and become nothing more than a "sheliach", an extension of his master Avraham Avinu, who is able to connect with the tefillot and the zechut of the person who has sent him on this mission. His name is not mentioned at all in this parsha, as he as an individual ceases to exist as he becomes the "yadda arichta", the outstretched arm of Avraham Avinu.

Eliezer Eved Avraham eventually disappears off the map of Jewish history, but only after he has personified for us a life of total dedication to Avraham, using all his considerable skills as a military leader, an effective educator and a diplomatic negotiator all combined in the personality of one truly
