### THE WONDER OF ISRAEL

There are events that occur in life that defy imagination. Events that were neither anticipated nor planned have significantly changed the course of history. When seen from a panoramic perspective, the world reveals astonishing twists and turns that quickly become assimilated into matter-of-fact realities. For years the idea that the Berlin Wall could fall was unthinkable. The thought of Communist Russia crumbling was no more than a dream. its unfolding, G-d's dreams become realities and we, in knowing this, collapse thousands of years into wonder-filled moments and the span of history rests whole and complete in the depths of the human soul.

### ISRAEL AND JEWISH UNITY

Throughout the Middle Ages, Jewish communities maintained a degree of contact with one another, however this became increasingly prevalent in the Early Modern period. Following the Expulsion, many Sephardim travelled eastward, eventually settling in the Ottoman Empire. This was during the period of Turkish expansion and soon the Ottomans came to rule over the Land of Israel.

Sephardi Jews, therefore, also migrated to several cities in Israel - to Safed, to the ancient holy city of Jerusalem and to Hebron. Safed, with several thousand Jews, was the largest of these settlements, becoming famous for its mystics and scholars. However, Jerusalem's Jewish population grew over time and by the 1700s it became the largest community.

Unfortunately, the Jews in Israel were given only limited economic rights. Furthermore, the Ottomans increasingly taxed these Jewish communities sending many into deep poverty. Their plight became the concern of world Jewry who strove to support them. In the seventeenth century the communities in Israel reached an internal agreement that money raised from the Jewish Diaspora would be split between each community. When Jews settled in Tiberias in the eighteenth century this economic cooperation was expanded to include them as well.

These four places of Sephardi Jewish settlement became known as Israel's 'four holy cities,' otherwise known as the 'yishuv hayashan,' 'the old settlement'. In contrast to this, the later Central and Eastern European Zionist migrations, which began in the late nineteenth century, were called the 'yishuv hahadash,' 'the new settlement.'

From the seventeenth to nineteenth centuries Sephardi Jews throughout the Diaspora gave an annual gift to 'the four holy cities of Israel' through a network of giving coordinated by Jewish officials in Istanbul. These 'pekidim' directed Israel-based emissaries to communities in the East and in the West. The rabbinic visitors informed local Jews about the state of affairs in Israel and encouraged communities and individuals to give accordingly. In so doing, they helped to unite the Jewish world.

Their efforts led to greater interconnectivity between Jewish communities with Israel at their centre. This increased cooperation and commitment to Jewish resettlement in Israel ultimately culminated in the political Zionism of modern times. This is important, because whilst the Torah has always unified the Jewish nation in principle, it is our shared commitment to fostering Jewish life in Israel that has helped to unify us in practice.

### YOM HA'ATZMAUT

Yom Ha'Atzmaut celebrates the Declaration of Israel's Independence in 1948, eight hours before the end of Britain's Mandate of Palestine.

Centuries of exile were suddenly over; Diaspora Jews had learned to be resourceful and resilient - to bounce back from the blows of social exclusion and outright persecution. But the murder of one third of world Jewry created a new type of Jew —a Jew prepared to train, to fight, to win if possible and to die if necessary. Many wars would follow immediately after Independence and in the years after but the quiet resignation of the ghetto Jew as he fought back his tears had gone. The free Jews of Israel would simply fight back.

The Declaration of Independence was initially drafted by lawyers, then politicians came in to resolve conflicts. A key issue was the phrase "placing our trust in the Almighty"; religious Jews favoured this while secular Jews opposed it. It was decided that the phrase "Rock of Israel" would be used, to be interpreted as referring either to G-d, or to the land and traditions of Eretz Israel.

It is important to recognise that both interpretations spring from the Torah. G-d is our father, our king. The Torah also contains the passport, visa and lease allowing the People of Israel to re-enter the land from Egypt.

Like any nation, Israel has made mistakes but it has corrected most - leaving today a land of democracy, hard work, innovation and maturity. In 2011, OECD ranked Israel the second most educated country in the world behind Canada. In 2015, Israel ranked sixth-healthiest country and among the top 18 nations on the UN Human Development Index above France.

Israel sets an example of ambition that rightly matches the national task, to be a "light unto the nations." All of Israel contributes, the more religious, the less religious, Israeli citizens, even those in the Diaspora.

Without independence we could not have thrived as we have. So we celebrate with our families in Israel, with our friends

in Israel, with all bearers of the light, those with a hand on the torch, strong and weak, seeking in its glow our ultimate redemption.

### WHAT ISRAEL MEANS TO ME

Israel is never far from our minds. We do not have a single prayer throughout the year without some sort of mention of Jerusalem or Sion. Regardless of one's geographical location one always faces Israel for prayers. We conclude the Pesah Seder and the Simhat Torah services with a fervent request to be in Jerusalem the following year. As a couple begins their new life together they are reminded, through shattering a dish, of the Temple that stood in Israel. We have always, and still have, a strong attachment to her.

Reciprocally, Israel too has always had an attachment to the Jewish people. She has stayed loyal to us even at times when we have not been loyal to her. When our ancestors deserved to live in the land of Israel she accommodated them and produced such abundance that she was metaphorically named the land 'flowing with milk and honey'. But when our ancestor's accommodation in Israel was no longer justified and we were exiled, she stayed devoted to us and remained desolate for our enemies who attempted to cultivate the land. Mark Twain, following a visit to Israel in 1867, famously wrote about Palestine in Innocents Abroad:

"A desolate country whose soil is rich enough, but is given over wholly to weeds... a silent mournful expanse... a desolation... we never saw a human being on the whole route... hardly a tree or shrub anywhere. Even the olive tree and the cactus, those fast friends of a worthless soil, had almost deserted the country."

Israel means many things to many different people. But what our Mesorah, tradition, teaches is that Erets Yisrael is designated for the Jewish people. The Land is cultivated only when we are living on its soil. Israel cries out for a Jewish return.

It warms my heart when I hear of someone making Aliyah and giving up a certain lifestyle to go and live

in Israel. I see the emigration of Jews to Israel as our nation coming back to its spiritual roots. During the 5 years I spent studying Torah in Israel I felt as though I was taking part in the spiritual re-awakening of the land. Although I am proud of my national identity, I have a strong affinity to Israel and await the day where Israel will be fully cultivated by our people.

In the words of Rabbi Yehuda Ha-levi, a 12th century Spanish philosopher: "My heart is in the East, and I in the uttermost West".

### What Israel Means To Me: Guest Debar Torah

When we come to this time of year with the dual celebrations of Yom Ha'atzmaut and Yom Yerushalayim we should thank Hashem that we are able to live in such times and thank Him for the miracle of our return to Israel after 2000 years.

I remember vividly, almost twenty five years ago, I was a student at Yeshivat Hakotel in Jerusalem and we had been told to stop our learning and go to the Diplomat Hotel in Jerusalem to be a part of something remarkable - to help welcome and look after the thousands of Ethiopian Jews who had just been rescued by the Jewish state.

Every day we daven 'v kabzenu m arba knafot ha aretz' 'and you will gather us from the four corners of the world.' Here I was, a witness to that tefillah being answered. That day demonstrated for me the central idea of kol visrael areivim zeh ba zeh - all Israel are responsible for each other - played out on a national scale. It showed me the miracle of the modern State of Israel and it demonstrated to me the incredible story of the Jewish people.

There is, of course, a third day during this time of year - Lag b Omer, does this also link into the Religious Zionist narrative? The best known reason for the celebration of Lag B' Omer is that Rabbi Akiva's students stopped dying. It is difficult to understand why we celebrate just because they stopped dying.

The Gemara, in fact, alludes not to a plague but to the followers of Rabbi Akiva who were soldiers in the ill-fated insurrection of Bar Kokhba against the Romans. In this view, the "plague" refers to a series of disastrous military defeats and Lag B'Omer marks a victory, which was at least a temporary source of hope and cheer.


This is why the death of Rabbi Akiva's students was so cataclysmic: with the crushing of the Bar Kokhba rebellion, the messianic expectation came crashing down to earth.

> A severe demoralization set in—a demoralization that threatened to overwhelm the generation and bring about despair for the future of Torah and the Jewish People. We were exiled, a long exile, seemingly without end. Against this background, Lag B'Omer represents the reassurance that "tomorrow is another day." There will eventually be a new beginning.

Rabbi Akiva heroically started over again, teaching five new students. R Yehudah, R Meir, R Nehemiah, R Yossi and a certain Rav Shimon bar Yochai - the very same who died on Lag B Omer.

R Akiva, despite all that had happened, his world destroyed - he rebuilt, he had hope. How perfectly does Lag B'omer of old therefore fit into the Religious Zionist dream of the last 60 or so years? It is a
