SALVATION IN UNLIKELY PLACES

One of the most significant parts of Shavuot is the reading of the Scroll of Ruth. At first glance, one cannot find a justification for this custom.

What is the connection between the story of Ruth and the receiving of the Torah?

The Torah is neither mentioned in the scroll, nor are there any Torah-giving related topics.

In the Midrash (Ruth Rabbah) the Rabbis give a few reasons for this.

One well known answer is that King David was born on Shavuot, and, since Ruth is his great grandmother, we read about her story.

However, the story of Ruth does not seem to encapsulate the essence of the holiday of Shavuot. There must be a more profound meaning for its inclusion.

In the scroll, we learn that the Davidic dynasty – the one that will produce the Mashiach who will bring the final redemption to all Jews - began through an ‘impure’ set of events.

First, Ruth wasn’t born Jewish. She married her Jewish husband without conversion, and only later in her life accepted the yoke of Judaism.

Later, we find that she is a pauper, collecting leftover grains with the rest of the poor. At the pinnacle of the story, Ruth schemes with her mother in law about how to seduce Boaz, the leader of Bet Lehem and a family relative, to take Ruth for a wife by lying in a field next to him.

Does Ruth’s life circumstance and behavior correlate with her position as the matriarch of the Davidic dynasty? With what we expect royalty should be?

While other religions boast leaders with pure bloodlines, Judaism does not. Moreover, rather than omitting the more unsavoury details about the lives of our great personalities, the books of the Tanakh give a clear recounting of their lives, the good with the questionable.

But why? And what is the link to Shavuot?

This teaches us that the Torah was given to everyone. To millions of men, women and children. To the Rabbi, lawyer and refuse collector. To all future generations. You do not have to be a Rabbi or have rabbinic lineage to be a part of this. You can even be a poor convert dedicated to God and the Torah.

The story of Ruth also teaches us that greatness can sprout from unlikely places. Our perception of greatness is not always correct. We must therefore validate and respect every person.

This is also an empowering message for us all: Perhaps the salvation will start with you?

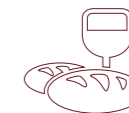

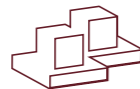

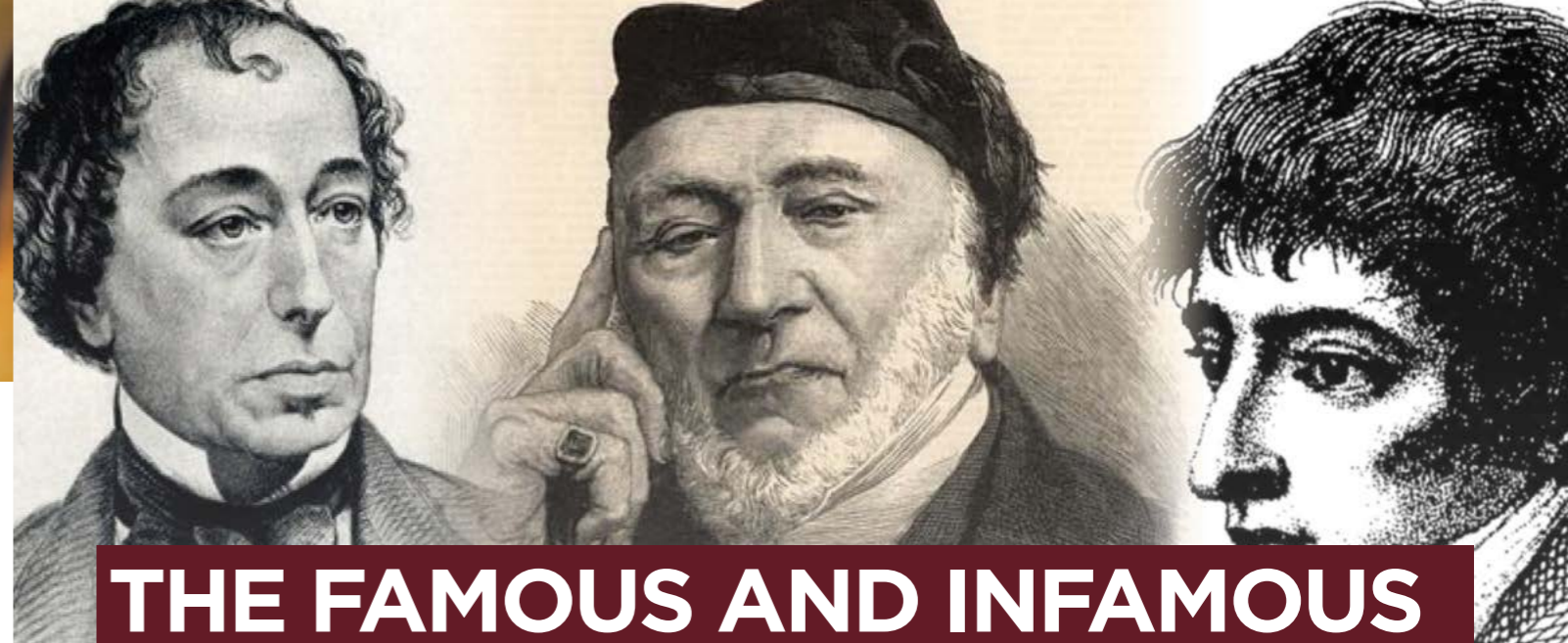

FREEDOM, ETCHED IN STONE

Having finished Pesach, we have achieved our liberty. Free from that which holds us down, binds us to false realities, we are able to act in any manner we choose. What is left to explore?

In Jewish thought, the pieces of our calendar come together as puzzle pieces, revealing a stunningly beautiful picture of the human spirit. Each chag moves towards the next, each a movement in the symphony of life. This is true no less with the journey from Pesach to Shavuot, a journey from liberty to Freedom.

On Pesach, we explore those parts of our life which hold us down, which prevent us from acting as we would otherwise. During the weeks leading up to Shavuot, and indeed on Shavuot itself, we explore the meaning of that liberty. What good is our ability to do what we like if we have no direction?

Our Sages saw the twin chagim of Pesach and Shavuot as one extended meeting point with God, a time of the year where we uncover the roots of our existence and our place in the world. It seems that Torah is this key, providing us a place to be within a world of placelessness. The question remains, however, how this could be? What does the Torah offer us that any other religious system doesn't? Isn't Judaism just another religion?

The answer, as we discovered on Pesach, begins at the very origin of our nation, with our forefather Abraham. Abraham's lifelong dedication to Truth and kedusha - uniqueness - led to an everlasting relationship with the source of Existence, God. This relationship would become a national inheritance, for wherever there are seekers of Truth, there is connection to Existence. The love affair Abraham had with God, his desire for arriving at the most fundamental understanding of our universe, bred an unbreakable relationship between Abraham, his children and God. Out of this relationship came the Torah - not a religious document but a love letter, a missive to the ones who would dedicate their life to Truth.

This dedication is what we aim to achieve between Pesach and Shavuot. Torah is not a disconnected set of rules that are imposed on our lives, but a set of instructions to allow us to become the best versions of ourselves that we can. The Gemara relates a story of R Yose, who proclaimed that were it not for the Torah, he'd just be another regular guy in the market, but with the Torah, he became his true self.

On Pesach we gain our liberty. On Shavuot we search for freedom, for our true selves. How will you use that freedom? Who are you?

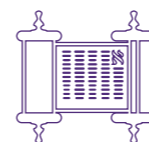

THOUGHTS OF THE NINTH

It is 9th Av and today I am haunted by Martin Gilbert (p.749) of another 'ninth', that of October 1940, when 600 frightened, 'unselected' Hungarian boys of Birkenau, aged 12 to 18 years, presaged their fate. Beneath the belching chimney, they are herded in the square and are running, naked, backwards and forwards in all kinds of haphazard paths, hopelessly pursuing means of salvation, hurrying, weeping and begging wildly, whilst their proud assailants belabour them with truncheons, driving them into the bunker.

At first I think of the stark symbolism of this scene. How we humans run aimlessly about, seeking our personal fortunes. We make our haphazard course through life, begging assistance from one hopeless source or another, putting our trust first in this direction and then in that!

I stray to think of the apparent cynicism whereby our Maker mocks us - and especially those still-innocent boys. It might have been different if the scene described was to be an object lesson for mankind! Alas it seems that only a very few outsiders will ever know of the episode and what lesson was to be derived by German guards, who were beyond the pale of moral rehabilitation anyway?

How can we fulfil our purpose of being witnesses? Already the generations are diluted in their apprehension of the facts and all-too-often disinterested. Some prefer to redefine the European persecutions as a more generalised, 'cruelty of mankind' sort of history. Of course, this is contrary to the express intention of the Germans and their accomplices, whose target was the Jews, above all else.

The period dealt with in Gilbert's work is but a part of a long story and heritage! Passing on the rich intensity of the generations in a meaningful and failsafe way is truly a difficult prospect. It is a purpose beyond merely surviving. It is the Plan set out for us and, though we can understand it very imperfectly and accept it even less, we may strive to do so by always seeking to think beyond the material, to reach for a relationship with the Devisor of that Grand Purpose.

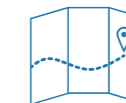

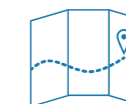

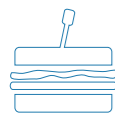
