Why is it needed?

The S&P Sephardi Community is much more than the three synagogues that we value and love.


It is our Beth Din which provides a religious legal framework for our Jewish lives: It is our Sephardi Kashrut Authority (SKA) ensuring that we have the widest choice of kosher food at home, at work, in our synagogues and at our semahot.

It is our Shaare Tikvah Sunday School, which has been providing continuous education for our children since 1701.

It is our Welfare Support helping many Sephardi families, and it is our ever expanding range of adult educational and cultural programmes providing learning and social activities for all. These amenities, which many of us may have come to rely on as part of our daily lives, are services that unfortunately cannot exist without your help, and our community's finances need to be in better shape.

Annual Finta contributions allow us to cover the day to day running costs of our three synagogues; however, we need extra funds to help pay for these essential services as well as improvements to our facilities that we all want, need and enjoy.

We currently run an annual deficit of £300,000 despite generating £1.5m through Finta and other income contributions; and whilst we do all we can to keep our administrative costs to a minimum, our funds are not sufficient to be able to cover all of our facilities, projects and plans.





In addition to the day to day needs of the community, Rabbi Joseph Dweck, our Rabbonim and our leaders have exciting, ambitious plans covering every aspect of work: more learning, lectures and social events; enhanced environments and upgraded facilities; improved engagement with existing and new members as well as reaching out to all Sephardim.

We must do this in order to strengthen our community and take our place among the leaders of Anglo Jewry; providing an authentic Jewish version of high-definition Judaism as well as continuing to provide a range of vital services for our members and the wider Sephardi community.


